What is the RHAM Inquiry Academy?

Q: How many students are accepted into the RHAM Inquiry Academy?

A: There are only 40 spots available.

Q: What is the application deadline?

A: All applications are due to RHAM Middle School no later than February 17, 2023.

Q: Is this an "honors" or advanced program?

A: No, as with other teams, honors level classes are offered as well as classes for all levels of learning.

Q: Can my special education student with an IEP be in this program?

A: Yes, but not all typical supports will be available. Co-taught classes are not always available, but the nature of the program will encourage learning in a way that best suits an individual's learning style.

Q: What World Languages are offered in the Inquiry Program?

A: Spanish and French are the two World Languages Inquiry Students can sign up to take.

What is Genius Hour?

Genius Hour is a class in which students design a project of their own interest, and then research and present their learning. It allows students to explore their own ideas and follow their passions. Students are expected to meet presentation, research and time management standards.

What else should I know?

Curriculum – Students will be required to meet all the same competencies as the traditional program.

Instruction – Teachers will follow an inquiry based model with a focus on collaboration and frequent small group work.

Assessment – Assessments will be designed to allow students to show their mastery of a skill or concept in multiple ways.

Schedule – Students follow the middle school schedule, but the Inquiry Academy schedule allows for flexibility of scheduling among core subjects (English, social studies, science and math).
